
**WHEREAS**, the College Administration has reviewed and recommended the attached Tuition and Fee Schedule for the 2022-23 Academic year; and



OPERATING BUDGET FOR THE 2022-23 ACADEMIC YEAR**

**WHEREAS**, budget allocations for the 2022-23 fiscal year align College resources with the goals and objectives of the College's Strategic Plan, *Lazer Focus 2016-21*; and


**WHEREAS**, the College administration has developed and presented a base institutional operating budget request of \$62,555,760 and proposed grant funding of \$5,600,000 for 2022-23;

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that subject to the approval of the Onondaga County Legislature, a base institutional operating budget, including grant activity, for the 2022-23 fiscal year in the total amount of \$68,155,760 with a sponsor contribution of up to \$9,872,000 be adopted and submitted to the Board of Trustees of the State University of New York for approval.

**RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE ONONDAGA COMMUNITY COLLEGE'S APPLICATION FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE NATIONAL COUNCIL FOR STATE AUTHORIZATION RECIPROCITY AGREEMENTS (NC-SARA)**

**WHEREAS**, to deliver distance education programs, including synchronous, asynchronous, and hybrid online programs across state lines, a college must demonstrate that it meets distance education programming standards set forth by individual states and the U.S. Department of Education-recognized accrediting agencies, including the Middle States Commission on Higher Education; and

**WHEREAS**, to register new academic programs in the State of New York for more than 50% online delivery, a college must demonstrate participation in the National Council for State Authorization Reciprocity Agreements (NC-SARA); and

**WHEREAS**, NC-SARA streamlines the process by which institutions in member states demonstrate compliance with quality standards in distance education and provides an efficient and cost-effective means of demonstrating this compliance; participation in NC-SARA demonstrates to accreditors and the public that a college is committed to student consumer protections and observes research-based best practices in delivering distance education programs; and

**WHEREAS**, Onondaga Community College is preparing its application to NC-SARA and will plan to deliver all necessary services and supports to distance education students through the Community Care Hub; Counseling Center; Financial Aid; Learning Center; Office of Accessibility Resources; Onboarding; Registration and Records; Student Coaching and Advising Network within each School; Student Orientation, Leadership, and Engagement; Student Rights and Responsibilities; and Veteran and Military Services; and

**WHEREAS**, Onondaga Community College and its faculty will ensure that academic rigor and integrity are maintained in delivering distance education programs by setting and adhering to standards for online course development, delivery, and assessment; offering distance education-focused faculty development opportunities through the Center for Teaching and Learning Innovation; and, assessing distance education programs to ensure that they are of the highest quality and in compliance with standards set by accrediting agencies; and

**WHEREAS**, the delivery of academic programs by distance education has the potential to strengthen Onondaga Community College enrollment by better meeting the needs of adult learners and students living at a considerable distance from the College; the Faculty Senate and Office of Academic and Student Affairs will collaborate to consider which academic programs should be offered in a distance education format, with final approval provided by the President and Board of Trustees where applicable; and

**WHEREAS**, Dr. Kathleen Crabill, President, recommends that the Board of Trustees authorize Onondaga Community College's application for participation in NC-SARA;

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, the Board of Trustees authorizes the College's application for participation in NC-SARA.

**RESOLUTION TO APPROVE DENNIS O'CONNOR AS A RECIPIENT OF  
THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES JOHN H. MULROY FOUNDER'S AWARD**

**WHEREAS**, the Onondaga Community College Board of Trustees established the John H. Mulroy Founder's Award to recognize individuals whose meritorious service has advanced the mission, vision, and excellence of Onondaga Community College and enhanced its capacity to provide students with the opportunity to explore, discover, and transform their lives; and

**WHEREAS**, the John H. Mulroy Founder's Award recognizes individuals whose service-oriented leadership and contributions stand as an example of selfless dedication to the higher purpose and ideals to which the College aspires, serving as a model for others; and

**WHEREAS**, Mr. Dennis Connor established the Bettie Mann Stevens Endowed Scholarship in 2008 which is given to incoming or returning students that are matriculated in any degree program, full- or part-time, with a 2.0 GPA. It is a renewable award of \$1500 per year as long as the student maintains eligibility. The scholarship is in memory of his mother who was a strong proponent of higher education and encouraged Mr. O'Connor to attend OCC, from where he graduated in 1971. To this day, he remains a firm believer in the value of community colleges and his scholarship has supported 15 students since its inception; and

**WHEREAS**, upon his retirement from Kraft Foods in 2012, Mr. O'Connor has turned his attention to writing, taking writing classes and compiling short stories about his life. Published in 2020, "The Green Canoe and Me: Paddling Through Life," details his many experiences growing up in Syracuse and Central New York. On a recent visit to OCC, Mr. O'Connor stated "I was impressed with the cooperative effort between all stakeholders in education. I'm proud to be an alumnus of an institution that had humble beginnings and is now a leader in offering quality education and experience."; and







He is a member and OCC Representative on Congressman John Katko's Veterans Advisory Committee; member and OCC Representative on County Executive Ryan McMahon's Onondaga County Executive Veterans Advisory Board; and immediate Past President of Navy League of the United States/CNY Council. Dr. Trombetta supports youth groups which include the Naval Junior ROTC and Navy Sea Cadets units throughout the greater Central NY area. He was Master of Ceremonies for the Camillus Memorial Day Parade for the past decade and Past President of the NY State Communication Association; and





**RESOLUTION TO AWARD DEGREES TO CANDIDATES FOR MAY 2022**


**WHEREAS**, the Onondaga Community College Board of Trustees must approve a list of May 2022 candidates for degrees; and
