Call to Order

Faculty Senate

Trustee Alicea introduced Nina Tamrowski, Faculty Senate President, to provide an update. Professor Tamrowski began by stating that the faculty committees have been busy wrapping up their work for the semester. She was happy to see the conclusion of the NC-SARA work with the proposed resolution today. The course assessment process for the online classes has been completed and is now in place. General Education work and new program review continues as does the D2L conversion. There have been D2L delays on SUNY's end, but training will be available soon. Various faculty senate bylaw changes are pending approval at the upcoming plenary meeting as well as a number of resolutions. Moral issues continue to plaque faculty, particularly with the recent campus climate survey results.

Updates

New Academic Programs

Trustee Alicea introduced Anastasia Urtz, Provost & Senior Vice President, who introduced Assistant Provost, Dr. Christopher Thuot, and Dean, Health & Community Services, Karen Fabrizio, to provide an update on new programs. Dr. Thuot began with an overview of programs that would work well in an online format – or referred to as distance education programs. These include Creative Writing, Healthcare Administration, Health Information Technology, and Health Studies Certificate. Ms. Fabrizio continued the report with an update on new program development for 2021-22. This includes Architectural Design Studies, Construction Management, Social Media and Digital Communications, and Supply Chain Management.
